“And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; (6) And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; (7) And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. (8) For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our

Lord Jesus Christ.” 2 Peter 1:5-8.

Praise the Lord, and welcome back! Starting this month, I want to encourage you to hold up under trials, as well as provide some biblical insight to help you overcome whatever is weighing you down. We can start by understanding that while we are in this world, we will have tribulations. It’s a fact of life. What we need to know is how to hold up under the trials we are confronted with. Sometimes it takes a while to get that breakthrough. We may have to be under the load longer than we care to be. However, we can still obtain a decisive victory! Thank God for the Resurrected Savior!

I want us to focus specifically on **2 Peter 1:6** where patient is added to temperance. As I studied this passage, I began to feel the strength of what Peter, through the Holy Spirit, was conveying to the believer. That is, the summation of these graces does in fact make us that we shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to **Verse 10** of this chapter. In other words, we will not be empty or barren but instead bearing fruit in the knowledge of Jesus Christ, despite our trials.

Listen! We know already that growing in the knowledge of Jesus begins with the foundation of faith, to which we then add the quality of virtue (striving for excellence), which is manifested by our increasing in knowledge (those things regarding God’s will), to which we add the grace of temperance or self-control, which is mastering one’s desires and passions. Oh yes, they must be mastered and kept under subjection!

In our text, Peter tells us that to temperance or self-control we are to add patience or perseverance. Therefore, let’s take a moment to look at some things concerning perseverance. Let’s first look at the biblical definition of patient. You may or may not like its meaning because it’s very demanding.

The Greek word for patience literally means, “An abiding under, or bearing up under a load without being crushed.” Patience is also “a cheerful (or hopeful) endurance.” It implies suffering, enduring, or waiting, as a determination of the will and not simply under necessity or duress. That’s a whole different mindset!

In other words, I’m not going through because I have to, but I’m going to get through it because I want to. Give that some thought. It’s a determination of my will and not simply out of necessity. I’m not going through because I have to, but I’m going to get through it because I want to. Lord, have mercy! It’s like going to therapy. You don’t go because you have to (necessity) but because you want to (desired determination)! That’s a praise break!

Listen! Patience is more than just a passive virtue. Anybody can hang on to something when things get rough. But that’s not the real test. My friend, when trials and tribulations come, we have to keep moving. We can’t quit. We must be determined to get through it! Listen! Jesus did not quit! Nor should we! Stay tuned.

Launch Out Into the Deep

Scripture Focus: Luke 5:5-7 (NIV)

“Simon answered, ‘Master, we’ve worked hard all night and haven’t caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets.’ When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break.”

There will be seasons in life where you feel as though you are in the perfect position to receive blessings, breakthrough, and favor; however, God may require you to move into deeper waters before you can truly receive the abundance He has prepared for you.

Simon Peter understood fishing. It was his profession, his expertise, and his livelihood. Yet despite all his knowledge and experience, he spent the entire night fishing and caught absolutely nothing. Can you imagine being a professional fisherman and coming back empty-handed? Many of us know that feeling spiritually, emotionally, or financially. We have worked hard, prayed faithfully, and done everything we know to do, but it seems as though nothing is happening.

Then Jesus gave Simon an unexpected instruction: move into deeper waters and let down the nets again. From a natural perspective, the instruction did not make sense. Simon could have easily questioned Jesus by saying, “I have been fishing for years. If there are no fish here, why would I go deeper?” Yet Simon chose obedience over understanding. He moved in faith because Jesus spoke.

How often does God ask us to move beyond what is comfortable and familiar? Sometimes He tells us to leave shallow places of fear, doubt, routine, and complacency so we can experience deeper faith and greater trust in Him. The deeper waters may look uncertain, uncomfortable, or unfamiliar, but they are often the very places where miracles happen.

God will sometimes direct us toward things that seem unusual or questionable to others. The less common direction may actually be the divine direction. What appears risky to us is fully known by God. He sees the overflow before we even see the opportunity.

Because Simon obeyed, the blessing was greater than he could contain alone. The catch was so abundant that the nets began to break, and other fishermen had to come help gather the overflow. The blessing became so large that the boats themselves began to sink under the weight of the abundance.

This is what happens when obedience meets faith. God does not simply bless enough—He blesses beyond measure. Sometimes changing direction under God’s instruction produces abundance beyond imagination.

What deeper waters is God calling you into today? Is He asking you to trust Him more, pray more boldly, step out into ministry, forgive someone, pursue purpose, or let go of fear? Your overflow may be waiting in the very place you are hesitant to go.

Do not allow fear, comfort, or past disappointment to keep you in shallow waters. Trust God enough to move deeper. Your obedience today may lead to the overflow you have been praying for tomorrow.

Prayer of Encouragement

Heavenly Father, thank You for reminding us that our blessings are often found in deeper waters. Help us to trust You even when Your instructions do not make sense to us. Strengthen our faith to move beyond fear, doubt, and comfort so we may experience the abundance You have prepared for our lives. Teach us to walk in obedience and trust Your direction completely. May our lives overflow with Your favor, grace, and purpose so that others may also be blessed through what You have done in us. In Jesus Christ’s Name, Amen.

Pneumatology Part II

Greetings, everyone!

A few months ago, I introduced the subject of Pneumatology. The term *pneuma* is derived from the Greek word for “breath” or “spirit,” and *-ology* refers to “the study of.” Accordingly, Pneumatology is the theological study of the Spirit. In biblical teaching, this subject directs our attention to the person and work of the Holy Spirit. This month, our study will focus specifically on the titles of the Holy Spirit.

The titles used for the Holy Spirit in Scripture reveal important truths about His nature, ministry, and relationship to God’s people. Studying these titles helps us understand more clearly how the Holy Spirit is presented throughout the Bible.

Identity of the Holy Spirit

The titles of the Holy Spirit first help us understand His identity. Scripture presents Him not as an impersonal force, but as fully divine. In **Genesis 1:2**, the Spirit of God is present and active at creation, showing His divine nature from the beginning. In **1 Corinthians 2:11**, Paul teaches that the Spirit knows the deep things of God, revealing His full participation in the being of God. In **Matthew 28:19**, the Holy Spirit is named alongside the Father and the Son in the baptismal formula, underscoring His place within the fullness of the Godhead. These passages show that the Holy Spirit is truly God and worthy of the same reverence, faith, and obedience given to the Father and the Son.

Work of the Holy Spirit

The titles of the Holy Spirit also reveal His work among God’s people. He is called the Helper and the Spirit of Truth because He actively teaches, guides, and testifies to Christ. In **John 14:26**, Jesus identifies the Holy Spirit as the Helper who teaches believers and brings His words to remembrance. In **John 15:26**, the Spirit is called the Spirit of Truth who proceeds from the Father and bears witness to Christ. In **John 16:13**, Jesus says that the Spirit of Truth will guide believers into all truth, showing His continuing ministry of instruction and revelation. Together, these passages teach that the Holy Spirit is not distant or inactive, but continually at work in illuminating truth and directing believers toward Christ.

Relationship of the Holy Spirit

Finally, the titles of the Holy Spirit show His relationship to the Father, the Son, and believers. He is called the Spirit of Christ, the Spirit of His Son, and the Spirit of Adoption, each title revealing His close and personal ministry in the life of God’s people. In **Romans 8:9**, the Spirit is described as the Spirit of Christ, emphasizing the inseparable relationship between Christ and those who belong to Him. In **Galatians 4:6**, God sends the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, confirming our place as His children. In **Romans 8:15–16**, the Spirit of Adoption assures believers that they are sons and daughters of God and moves them to cry, “Abba, Father.” These passages remind us that the Holy Spirit not only reveals divine truth but also brings believers into the living experience of fellowship with God as His children. Next month, we will continue.

Marriage Matters *Communication Matters (Part 5)*

There was a time when I was so busy that I needed a clone. I was so busy, my wife said, “Where is my husband?” I’m sure some of you can identify with this, as it is difficult to achieve success without a high-tempo lifestyle. I was physically there every day, but that’s all. Real connection and communication require your body, mind, and lips. Spending quality time with your spouse means more than merely being in the same room or car. It means talking, touching, focusing, and being considerate.

In this article, as in the last article, I want to highlight the importance of healthy communication again. A key part of effective communication involves using your ears as well as your mouth. Two key points for effective listening in a marriage are: 1) Practice listening attentively to what your spouse is saying, and 2) Practice listening attentively to what your spouse is NOT saying.

There is a difference between listening and hearing. We all hear sounds, even in our subconscious, but that does not mean we are paying attention to them. Anyone who has raised children knows exactly what I mean. Listening means actively paying attention to what you hear. When you actively listen, you can repeat back what was said, if not verbatim, in your own words. Although hearing is one of our five senses, listening is an acquired art that requires intentionality.

As you are listening to what is being said, ensure you pay attention to body language, tone, and what is not being said. There are times when more is communicated by what a person doesn’t say than what they actually say. It is important to be open and transparent when communicating with each other. If that’s true, why do so many couples withhold pertinent information? Two reasons are the lack of trust and fear of retribution. These, and other reasons, will destroy any opportunity for a healthy and meaningful dialogue.

Verbal abuse is far too common in marriages. It creates a toxic environment, erodes the harmony of a holy matrimony, and causes the abused spouse to stop expressing their true feelings to avoid ridicule and belittlement. Control through words and invalidation of one’s worth inevitably creates a severe power imbalance. This occurs when one person’s voice dominates the other. Here are examples of verbal abuse:

- Criticizing constantly, disguised as “help.” (Note: Criticism is the expression of disapproval of someone or something based on perceived faults or mistakes. Constructive criticism is similar, but has a positive intent delivered to help, not harm, avoids personal attacks, and is done with a respectful tone.)
- Mocking, being sarcastic, or making demeaning jokes, especially in front of others.
- Dismissing emotions instead of acknowledging them by invalidating one’s worth. Examples: “Don’t be ridiculous.” “It’s not that serious.” “Why are you always overreacting?”
- Using controlling statements camouflaged as “concern.” Examples: “You shouldn’t wear that” or “You shouldn’t feel like that.”
- Using threats masked as jokes. Examples: “You would be nothing without me” or “Good luck finding someone better.”

If you find yourself guilty of any of the examples above, I implore you to stop the verbal abuse immediately. Repent and ask God to help you. Consider getting professional help. Even Christians need professional help sometimes. It is not an admission of weakness. It is an admission of the truth, and the truth will make you free (**John 8:32**). Remember, “When you listen to your spouse, you send him/her the message that you believe he/she has something worthwhile to say, that he/she has value.” ~ The Art of Listening by H. Norman Wright.

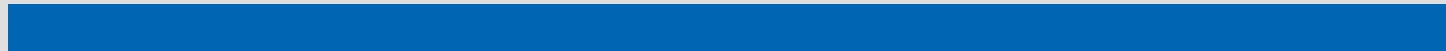
God Brings Healing to the brokenhearted. Not only does He heals us physically, but emotionally as well. What a mighty God we serve!
